Sunday's Readings... Zekiel is granted a vision of the restored Temple of God, the place of his dwelling. From it flows a wonderful stream that

brings with it life. For the Jews, the Temple was the holiest place on earth, a place where God and man drew close to each other, and where God's love and mercy were given through the sacrifices offered on the altar. God's plan for our salvation is fulfilled however in the person of his Son, Jesus. In him, who is both God and man, God comes to his people and is offered on the altar of the Cross to show us love and mercy. From his pierced side flows the stream of blood and water that brings eternal life to the world. St John tells us about both Jesus's concern for the holiness of the Temple and his foretelling of his own death and resurrection. He shows clearly how not only that a holy place must be treated as such, but that he is to be a new Temple; the place where God and man meet and out of which God's mercy flows.

Today we celebrate the Lateran Basilica, the



Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome, a church first built near the walls of the city of Rome by the Emperor Constantine in the fourth century. Every Diocese

celebrates the feast of the Dedication of its own Cathedral, since the cathedral is the mother and head of all the churches in the Diocese. The Lateran Basilica, since it is the place where the Pope has his *cathedra*, or Episcopal throne, is the 'Mother and Head of all the Churches of the City and the World'. On this day we both celebrate and pray for the unity of those churches gathered in communion with the successor of Saint Peter. The marbles and mosaics of the Lateran, which together form a beautiful building, are a sign of the beauty of God's family, the Church, united in worship, the living stones of the temple of the Lord. 
